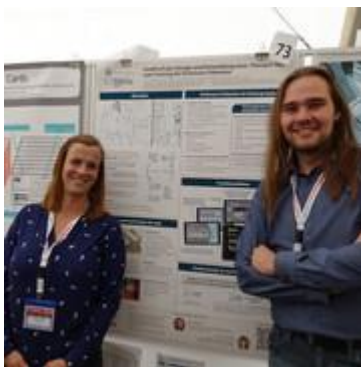
## General Medicine 4.0
